A Word From Pastor DK Angami

Why did the Himalayan Mission start in northern India? According to (www.aryan-arrival-in-india.com) around 1500 BC the Aryans came to northern India from Iran and southern Russia. They considered themselves as a high caste because of their skin color and considered the indigenous Dravidian as a low caste because of their darker skin. With this system created by Hindu-ism caste system conflicts began and gradually the Aryans moved the indigenous Dravidians to the south.

The gospel first reached southern India more than 2000 years ago by the Apostle Thomas. The result of this event is that a majority of Christian institutions and Christian resources have been located in the south and have stayed this way from generation to generation.
